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We will describe the Los Alamos electroplating's section involvement in the investigation of the phenomena of "cold fusion" claimed by Fleischmann et.al., of the University of Utah. We relied primarily on extremely sensitive neutron counters for evidence of on-going nuclear reactions. We also looked for gamma ray emissions and excess tritium in our electrolyte for evidence that nuclear reactions have occurred. A number of experiments with the cell configurations suggested by S. B. Jones from Brigham Young University, were also performed. The results of the investigations will be presented.
